

Case Study: Cross-Border Infrastructure Settlement Framework

How IPG Engineered a Controlled, Multi-Jurisdiction Execution Architecture for a \$480M Renewable Energy Project

Executive Summary

A multinational consortium investing in a large-scale renewable energy project required a neutral, independent execution partner to supervise the controlled release of capital across three jurisdictions, four banking systems, and multiple regulatory environments.

The project demanded a rigorous, milestone-driven settlement structure capable of protecting investor capital while ensuring contractors received timely payments aligned with verified progress.

IPG was appointed as the central execution coordinator, responsible for designing and operating a controlled payment architecture that ensured transparency, compliance integrity, and settlement precision throughout the project lifecycle.

1. Background & Strategic Context

The Project

- Construction of a 280MW solar power plant
- Multi-stage EPC (Engineering, Procurement & Construction) contract
- Investors from Europe and the GCC
- Development site located in Sub-Saharan Africa
- Project value: USD 480 million

Client Objectives

The consortium required:

1. Independent oversight over all capital deployment

2. Enforceable settlement discipline across all project stages
3. Controlled release of funds tied strictly to verified milestones
4. Cross-border compliance compatibility
5. Protection against performance and jurisdictional risk

IPG was selected to design and supervise the entire transaction execution framework.

2. Challenges Identified

2.1 Multi-Jurisdiction Complexity

- Investor funds originating from the EU and GCC
- Settlement accounts located in a neutral financial centre
- EPC contractors operating across Africa and Asia
- Divergent regulatory, legal, and reporting standards

2.2 High Counterparty Risk

- EPC contractors required mobilisation advances
- Investors insisted on proof of progress before fund releases
- No single party could independently validate cross-border documents

2.3 Compliance & Documentation Risk

- Source of Funds/Wealth alignment
- Multi-party KYC/KYB verification
- Contract enforceability across borders
- Need for trustee-verified audit trails

2.4 Currency & Settlement Exposure

- USD, EUR, AED, and local currency corridors
- Risk of currency mismatch and timing delays

The project demanded an institutional-grade execution framework that eliminated ambiguity and enforced accountability.

3. IPG's Solution Architecture

IPG developed a structured, enforceable execution and settlement framework consisting of four core pillars:

Pillar 1: Controlled Payment Governance Framework

- Designed a tiered milestone-based disbursement model
- Established a central “Execution Control Matrix” aligning:
 - Verified engineering progress
 - Third-party inspection reports
 - Trustee approvals
- Implemented independent oversight via regulated fiduciary partners

This ensured zero unauthorised fund movement.

Pillar 2: Multi-Jurisdiction Settlement Coordination

IPG orchestrated:

- Settlement accounts in a neutral banking jurisdiction
- Multi-currency routing pathways
- Documentation flows and legal validation
- Harmonisation of standards between EU, GCC, and African regulators

Result: Seamless cross-border execution despite jurisdictional fragmentation.

Pillar 3: Compliance & Documentation Intelligence

IPG coordinated:

- Full KYC/KYB for all stakeholders
- Source of Funds verification
- Contractual enforceability review via multi-jurisdiction legal counsel
- Sanctions, AML, and regulatory screening
- Creation of a centralised compliance vault accessible to fiduciaries

Outcome: Zero compliance gaps across the entire project duration.

Pillar 4: Real-Time Oversight & Reporting

IPG deployed:

- A structured settlement calendar
- Transaction verification dashboards
- Real-time reporting to investors and trustees
- Independent audit trails for every disbursement

Outcome: Total transparency and full investor visibility.

4. Implementation Timeline

Phase	Duration	Key Milestones
Phase 1: Structuring	6 weeks	Framework design, fiduciary onboarding, legal harmonisation
Phase 2: Compliance & Documentation	5 weeks	Verification, contract integration, account alignment
Phase 3: Execution Launch	3 weeks	Activation of controlled payment systems
Phase 4: Settlement Cycle	22 months	Milestone-based disbursements, reporting, verification
Phase 5: Final Completion	4 weeks	Close-out reconciliation, audit delivery

5. Results & Impact

5.1 Capital Protection

100% of funds were deployed only after achieving verifiable milestones. No premature disbursements occurred.

5.2 Execution Discipline

Every payment aligned perfectly with the contractual schedule due to IPG's central oversight.

5.3 Enhanced Investor Confidence

Investors increased their exposure in later tranches after witnessing flawless settlement execution.

5.4 Cross-Border Risk Mitigation

The execution framework neutralised:

- Jurisdictional risk
- Banking corridor delays
- Compliance gaps
- Contractor performance deviations

5.5 Zero Settlement Disputes

All parties accepted IPG's independent governance, resulting in zero legal or operational disputes.

6. Key Learnings

- Complex, cross-border projects require neutral, independent execution partners
 - Multi-jurisdiction settlement frameworks must be designed upfront, not after contracts are signed
 - Fiduciary alignment significantly reduces counterparty risk
 - Controlled payment structures accelerate project delivery by eliminating ambiguity
 - Transparency builds durable trust between investors and operators
